## **NOVEMBER - THE MONTH OF PRAYER FOR THE DEAD**

As the leaves drop off the trees and much of nature around us seems to our eyes to be dying, it seems an obvious time of year for our thoughts to be drawn to the reality of death – the one sure thing that each of us will face. But for the Christian death isn't so much about endings, but change and new beginnings. So, in the Requiem Mass the celebrant prays: 'Indeed for your faithful, Lord, life is changed, not ended, and, when this earthly dwelling turns to dust, an eternal dwelling is made ready for them in heaven.'

Funerals are a lot more complex these days – even for Catholics. At one time the faithful had a very straightforward understanding of what was happening – that a funeral was an act of worship, usually in its most perfect form of the Mass. In Masses for the dead, the sacrifice of Christ - made sacramentally present in the here and now - is offered for the soul of the departed for the forgiveness of their sins so that they would share, in God's good time, the glory of the resurrection. Nowadays, in this more secular age, we often find funeral services termed 'Celebrations of Life' – often aping that of humanist ceremonies. For humanists that appears right - as this life is all there is. But for Catholics - not so! In the Apostle's Creed we state: I believe in…the resurrection of the body and life everlasting. This reminds us that eternal life begins at our baptism – not at death. It continues through death and will have no end.

Many of us will have experience of caring for the dying. It is a tangible sign of our love and our connectedness with them. For us, this care and connectedness doesn't end at the moment of death. God has given us the great gift of being able to continue that care and love by our prayers and by the offering of Masses.

Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord and let light perpetual shine upon them.
